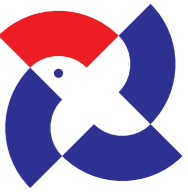

Industries

Fisheries

Japan's leading fisheries cluster. Implementing aquaculture using advanced technology

Nagasaki is known as "The City of Delicious Seafood." With Kuroshio, the world's largest ocean current, running along its coast, the city enjoys excellent fishing grounds that are home to more than 250 types of fish - said to be the most in Japan - and harvests the second largest* catch in Japan. The fisheries industry has been highly active for 400 years, and the city supplies seasonal seafood products to Japan and overseas in spring, summer, autumn, and winter. Marine aquaculture is operated in quiet inlets, and the city produces the largest* amount of blowfish - known as a high-grade fish - in Japan. The region's unique processed marine products are produced using the advanced marine product processing technologies that the area has developed over many years.

In recent years, with the aim of shifting from simply catching fish to nurturing marine resources, and adding high value to marine products, the industry is focusing on efforts including releasing fisheries seedlings, creating seaweed beds, and holding events such as the Nagasaki Fish Festival. In aquaculture, the industry is using IoT and developing robots for monitoring fish and is developing the following to promote the future of aquaculture: (1) Large-scale offshore aquaculture with floating fish tanks (2) Closed-circulation land-based aquaculture that purifies and reuses pumped seawater (3) Hybrid-type land-based aquaculture where free-flowing seawater is pumped into fish tanks

Shipbuilding / Machinery Manufacturing Industry

Utilizing the city's experience in shipbuilding/machinery technology to develop new fields such as marine energy and environment

Nagasaki's shipbuilding and machinery industry has grown since the Edo Shogunate started construction of Nagasaki Yotetsusho Foundry - Japan's first warship repair facility - in 1857, and this key industry has played an important role in regional economic development. In 2013, the government designated the city as "Base of Marine and Environmental Industry in Nagasaki" to promote the construction of high-value-added ships and energy efficient ships. The aim is to create a base for related industries in the field of marine energy. Nagasaki has become a fertile ground for active exchanges between shipyard engineers and researchers at academic institutions, and another strength is that the city is an ideal environment for learning the advanced skills and techniques required for shipbuilding and machinery.

In recent years, the city has been promoting the deployment of advanced technologies to aid ship operation and maintenance services using IoT and Big Data, and has formed a marine cluster through industry-academia-government collaboration to utilize technologies in new fields such as energy and the environment.

Nagasaki Shipyard & Machinery Works owned by Mitsubishi Heavy Industries has some of the largest equipment in Japan and has a strong track record of building various ships such as large passenger ships, LNG carriers, and military vessels. The facility is currently working on repairing passenger ships. In the land-based field, the facility is developing clean energy technologies such as fuel cells as well as the world's most advanced high-efficiency thermal power generation equipment, while in the aviation field it is producing aircraft engine parts.



Academia

Tropical Medicine

Leading domestic and overseas tropical medicine research centered on the Institute of Tropical Medicine, Nagasaki University, the only tropical medicine research base in Japan

Nagasaki City is home to the Institute of Tropical Medicine, Nagasaki University, the only tropical medicine research base in Japan, where leading domestic and foreign researchers conduct research into tropical medicine.

With the rapid progress of international mobility and the need for a global approach to infectious disease control, the Institute of Tropical Medicine, Nagasaki University has established overseas education and research bases in Kenya and Vietnam to address malaria, cholera, dengue and other diseases. The Institute is conducting research in collaboration with academic institutions in Japan and overseas to overcome these diseases. The Institute has also been designated as a "WHO Collaborating Center for Reference and Research on Tropical Viral Diseases" since 1993, and has been active as a member of the Global Outbreak Alert and Response Network (GOARN). The Institute is actively involved in international cooperation efforts such as participation in Japan International

Cooperation Agency (JICA) projects and emergency relief teams.

One recent example was in 2019 when Nagasaki University and Shionogi & Co., Ltd. signed a comprehensive cooperation agreement aiming to create new drugs in the field of infectious diseases focused on malaria. The two parties also established the Shionogi Infectious Disease Division to promote industry-academia collaboration. As a core institution for infectious disease research, Nagasaki University works with nine universities in Japan to promote the formation of infectious disease research centers centered around the BSL-4 facility*. These efforts are strongly supported by the government.

* BSL-4 facility: A facility that can safely handle pathogens of infectious diseases that are considered to be more dangerous than new coronavirus (COVID-19). BSL-4 facilities are required when conducting research and development into diagnostic methods, vaccines, treatment methods, etc.

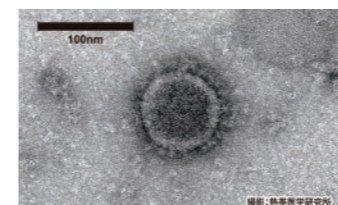
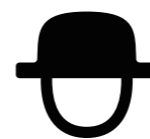


Image of the COVID-19 taken by electronic microscope

The Institute of Tropical Medicine, Nagasaki University is the only institution in Japan that specializes in tropical medicine. Researchers from all over the world participated in the 59th Annual Meeting for the Japanese Society of Tropical Medicine, and the event was a great success. The Society took various steps such as inviting the CEO of the GHIT Fund*, which invests in research and development of tropical medicine. The event became a catalyst for creating many new international joint research projects. Both the participants and Nagasaki residents who participated in the Public Lecture praised the event. We hope to hold more international conferences in the field of tropical medicine in Nagasaki.

*GHIT Fund is an abbreviation of Global Health Innovative Technology Fund.

Radiology

The home of the Atomic Bomb Disease Institute, Nagasaki University, a research center for radiation medicine

As a city that was struck by an atomic bomb, Nagasaki City is home to the Atomic Bomb Disease Institute, Nagasaki University, one of the leading research bases for radiation medicine in Japan.

Since its founding in 1962, it has been providing radiation disaster/medicine support for cases such as the Chernobyl and Fukushima accidents by making use of its experience in radiation disaster/medicine built up through years of medical care for atomic bomb survivors.

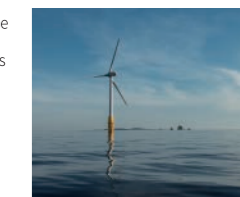
Marine Science

A major cluster for marine science research, promoting the world-leading development, utilization, and conservation of oceans

Nagasaki University, Nagasaki Institute of Applied Science, Nagasaki Prefecture, and Nagasaki Marine Industry Cluster Promotion Association signed a cooperation agreement to promote industry-academia-government collaboration. The aim is to contribute to the formation of a base for marine renewable energy-related industries, seeking to promote all stages from demonstration projects to commercialization.

Based on the concept of a marine technology cluster built on Nagasaki's marine energy and fisheries industry, the Organization for Marine Science and Technology, Nagasaki University, an international center for research and utilization of marine energy and conservation of the marine biological environment, is conducting projects such as the following: (1) A demonstration of tidal power generation (2) Innovative remote operation of offshore wind power and aquaculture facilities (3) Development of maintenance technology (4) Assessment of the state of drifting sea debris using robots and IoT (5) Creation of a comprehensive marine fisheries industry based on the cultivation of marine life (6) Coexistence of offshore wind power with fisheries and the region. The Nagasaki Institute of Applied Science was founded as a shipbuilding school and has greatly contributed to the development of the shipbuilding industry in Nagasaki.

Currently, in addition to shipbuilding, it is conducting research in the fields of marine science such as fisheries resources, marine resources, and underwater robots.

Nagasaki Trivia

As well as Dejima being the gateway to intercultural communication, it also laid a foundation for western medical development.

As a port for shogunate-licensed trading ships, Nagasaki was in trade worldwide up until the early Edo period. Even during Japan's self-isolation period, Nagasaki was still allowed to trade with foreign nations such as the Netherlands and China. Various foreign products and cultures, therefore, spread all across Japan through Nagasaki.

Philipp Franz von Siebold, landed on Dejima in 1823, was one of the doctors who took care of Dutch residents in the island. He later founded a private school named "Narutaki-Juku" in the suburbs of Nagasaki city for Japanese who were wishing to learn cutting-edge Western medicine. Dr. Siebold enlightened students in the school, playing a crucial role in laying the foundation of not only Nagasaki but Japan's Western medicine development.

Not only the home for Castella and Champon, Nagasaki is a fish-lover's paradise!

Nagasaki, surrounded as it is by the sea on three sides, has the largest array of fish caught in Japan. (Approximately 250 different types.) It has commonly been assumed that the trigger for Mr. Tomisaburo Awajiya (the son of Thomas Blake Glover) on the fish Encyclopedia "Glover Atlas" was the result of him noticing the large amount of fish being caught.



Peace

Nagasaki, the city which longs for the abolition of nuclear arms and perpetual peace.

During the second world war, Nagasaki, as well as Hiroshima, had an atomic bomb dropped upon it.

At 11:02 a.m. on August 9, 1945, a single atomic bomb detonating over Nagasaki instantly reduced the city to rubble, taking uncountable precious lives.

So that this tragic occurrence is never forgotten, but also never repeated, the citizens of Nagasaki are working on various activities to promote peace.

Therefore - so as not to let nuclear weapons be used - Nagasaki, as the last ground zero, shall keep sending messages worldwide calling for the abolition of nuclear weapons and the attainment of peace.

Tatsujiro Suzuki, Vice Director and Professor, Research Center for Nuclear Weapons Abolition, Nagasaki University and Chair, The Organizing Committee of Nagasaki Conference of the 61st Pugwash Conference on Science & World Affairs(2015)

The Pugwash Conferences on Science and World Affairs is an international organization of scientists that calls for the abolition of nuclear weapons and war. Holding the Pugwash Conference on Science & World Affairs in Nagasaki in 2015, 70 years after the atomic bomb was dropped, held great significance. The venue, Loujima, is known as a resort area blessed with rich nature. It was an ideal environment for the participants to spend time together to hold intensive discussions undisturbed. During the site visit, participants heard directly from victims of the atomic bombing and visited the bombed areas and the Nagasaki Atomic Bomb Museum. The event had a great impact on participants and was highly praised.

Hidden Christians who kept their religious faith amid oppression A miracle finding of believers has astonished the world !

In the middle of the 16th century, Christianity arrived in Nagasaki, which was the first Japanese city opened to the world. Even amid the severe suppression of Christianity by the Tokugawa Shogunate, Christians went underground to continue practicing Christianity over the ensuing two centuries, thus transmitting their faith to the next generation.



"Hidden Christian Sites in the Nagasaki Region" is a serial property comprising 12 components (three of which are located in Nagasaki city) which was registered as a World Cultural Heritage in 2018 for one of the unparalleled properties that tells the history of hidden Christians.

Cameras

In 1848, Shunnojou Ueno obtained a machine named Daguerreotype (the first successful form of camera/photography) from a Dutch merchant. Hikoma Ueno, the son of Shunnojou, studied photography and opened a studio in Nagasaki, thus becoming the first professional photographer in Japan.

Billiards

There had already been some billiard tables in a Dutch trading house around 1767. Keiga Kawahara, who was the designated painter for Philipp Franz von Siebold, depicts people playing pool in "Scroll with views of the Dutch Factory and Chinese Quarter in Nagasaki".

Coffee

The introduction of coffee to Japan dates back to when Dutch vessels brought coffee to Dejima. Although people were initially reluctant to try coffee claiming that it had a bitter taste and a burning smell, there were already quite a few people who adored coffee by the time Siebold arrived in Nagasaki.



Badminton

A game called "kōmō-Hagoita" is mentioned in a book entitled "kōmō zatsuwa" which introduces Dutch habits in Dejima. A monument to the origin of badminton can be found on its site.

Seasonal traditions throughout the year that are in Nagasaki.

Hata-age

The main design of flags called "Hata" in Nagasaki came from the Netherlands in the 15th century, getting inspiration from an image of the Dutch flag. Spring in Nagasaki commences with a kite festival (Hata-Gassen) where people fly their kites with strings coated with local vidro beads and attempt to sever their opponent's line.

Nagasaki Kunchi

Nagasaki Kunchi is an autumn festival, celebrating the local deity worshiped at Suwa Shrine. It is held from October 7th-9th, through the preparation beginning from June and "Niwamise" head on October 3rd. Hono-Odori (the dedicatory dance to the shrine), which each district performs once every 7 years, embodies the flamboyancy of Nagasaki.

The Spirit Boat Procession (Shōrō nagashi)

The procession, which takes place on August 15th of every year, is a traditional event held in Nagasaki Prefecture for sending off the deceased, who have passed away before Obon, to the Pure Land. ("Obon" is an annual Japanese holiday that remembers deceased ancestors.) The family of the deceased build a boat to mourn the spirit of their dear departed and wander around the town with the boat into the night amid the clamor of gongs and firecrackers.



Winter

Lantern Festival

In the Nagasaki of yesteryear, where many Chinese resided, the New Year of the lunar calendar was an important period for human interaction. Lantern Festival, with its origin in celebrating the Chinese new year, is a winter characteristic of Nagasaki. During this festival, approximately 15,000 red lanterns are lit throughout city's Chinatown, producing a dreamlike atmosphere.



Kankō Maru

Kankō Maru is Japan's first wooden steam-powered vessel presented to the Tokugawa shogunate from the Netherlands as a training vessel for the Nagasaki Naval Training Center.

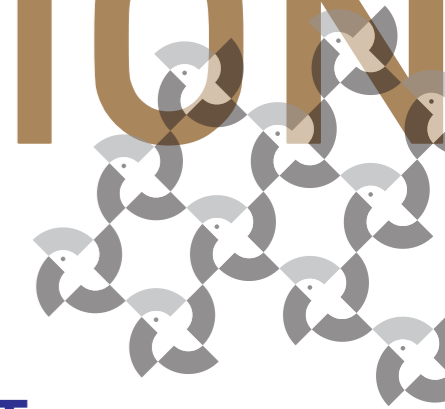
Bowling

In the late Edo period of May 1861, the first international bowling center was launched in the Nagasaki foreign settlement. That date of June 22nd - the day when the opening was reported by an advertisement in the local newspaper - has been designated as 'Japan Bowling day'.

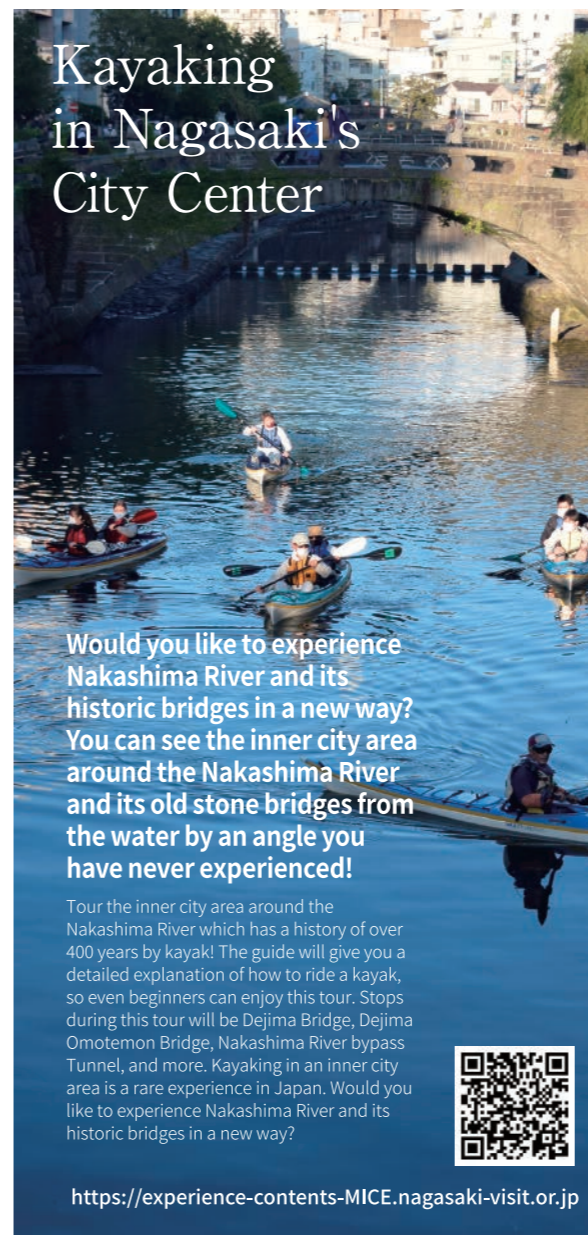

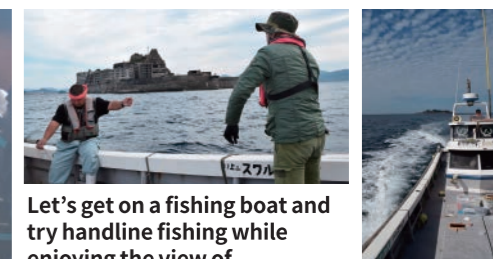
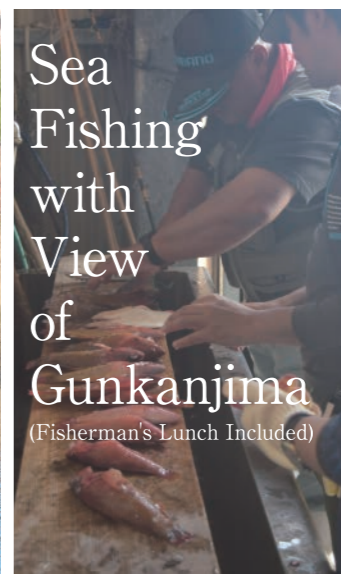

Sea Fishing with View of Gunkanjima

(Fisherman's Lunch Included)



Let’s get on a fishing boat and try handline fishing while enjoying the view of Gunkanjima Island. After fishing, you can try the experience having a taste of Nagasaki’s “Fisherman’s food”.

A local fisherman with years of experience will take you on his fishing boat at Nonogushi fishing port in Nagasaki city, on which you experience handline fishing whilst enjoying the view of Gunkanjima Island. The freshly caught fish will be cleaned and grilled over charcoal upon return to the fishing port, so you can have a taste of Nagasaki’s “Ryoshi meshi” (fisherman’s food). Nonogushi fishing port is the closest port from Gunkanjima Island.

Nagasaki Kite Making Experience



Learn the characteristics of Nagasaki kites and how to make them at a kite shop with a long history. After making your own kite, the shop owner will show you how to maneuver these special kites in a park nearby that has a spectacular view of Nagasaki port.

In Nagasaki, kites are called “Hata” and they differ in shape and color from other kite types found throughout Japan. The Ogawa Kite store is a handmade kite specialty store founded in 1907 and was designated as a traditional craft of the prefecture in 1993. You can learn how to make this traditional craft called “Hata” and bring it home as a souvenir. You can also learn how to fly Hata at a park with a spectacular view of Nagasaki port. (Shipping fee is extra. You can buy ornamental kites instead of taking home your kite if you wish to.)

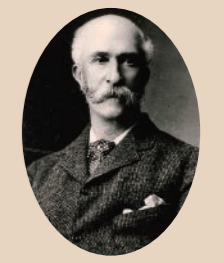


Nagasaki Trivia

Nagasaki Tartan is a token of friendship existing between Nagasaki and Scotland. (ThomasBlake Glover's birthplace).

Thomas Blake Glover played a crucial role in the modernization of Japan through the construction of a western-style dock that saw Nagasaki becoming a shipbuilding town. Commemorating the designation of Nagasaki as a pre-camping site for the 2019 Rugby World Cup, Nagasaki Tartan, associated with the city color of Nagasaki, has been donated from Glover's birthplace of Aberdeen, Scotland.

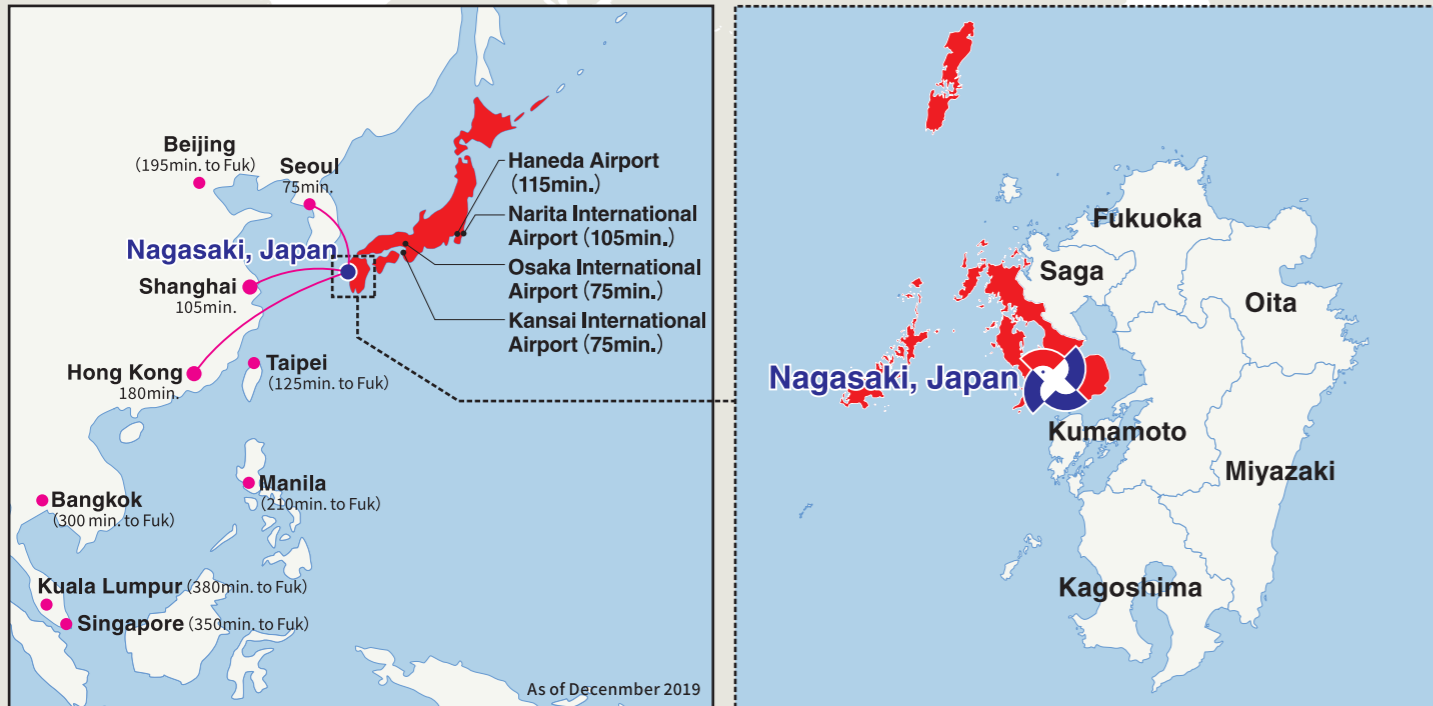

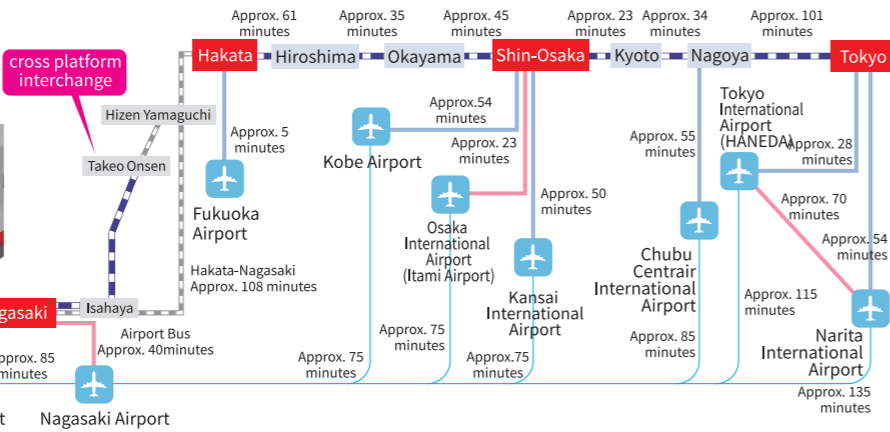
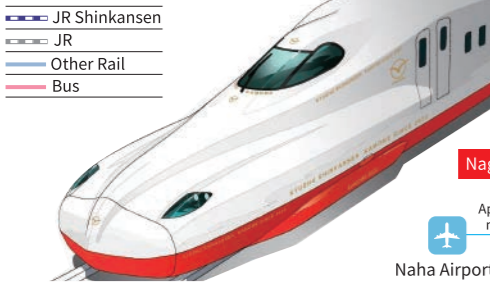
Greater accessibility will be possible with the opening of the Kyushu Shinkansen West Kyushu route as well as well-maintained highways.

Shippoku

Shippoku is one of Nagasaki's distinctive local dishes which combines elements of Japanese, Chinese and European cuisine. People sit around a red round table and eat course dishes on a large platter.



Nagasaki, a city where you can have delicious seafood

Nagasaki, in fact, has a greater number of different types of fish than Hokkaido, ranging from horse mackerel, conger eel, prawn, squid to pufferfish etc. In Nagasaki, surrounded as it is by the sea on three sides, a large number of delicious fish gather traveling on the Tsushima Current. Surprisingly, it is said that Nagasaki has the second largest catch and the largest array of fish caught in Japan



Nagasaki-Oden

"Kanboko" means "Kamaboko (fish cake)" in Nagasaki dialect. You can enjoy "Kanboko" in Oden simmered with Nagasaki's sophisticated flying fish soup. ("Oden" is a kind of traditional Japanese hotpot dish).



Japanese pufferfish

Nagasaki Prefecture has the largest aquaculture production of pufferfish in Japan. "Nagasaki pufferfish", which is a national brand, is renowned for its chewy texture and refreshing flavor.

Nagasaki-Hata

In Nagasaki, Kites are called "Hata" in its vernacular and registered as one of Nagasaki's traditional crafts. There are said to be from 200 to as many as 300 different kinds of patterns of kites, each of which has its own unique characteristic.



Castella

Castella is a fine confectionery representing Nagasaki as a nationally-renowned souvenir. Ranging from a traditional castella to a modern one, its sweetness and soft texture vary depending on shops, embodying as they do each shop's unique attraction.



Champon and Saraudon

Champon and Saraudon are the major noodle cuisines representing Nagasaki gourmet that have been adored by people since the Meiji era. Please enjoy the rich flavor made from a combination of exclusive soup, fresh ingredients and special noodles.



Kakuni-Manju

Kakuni-Manju is a dish which is simply braised pork belly in a steamed bun sandwich. You can enjoy it in one hand whilst strolling about the town.

Karasumi

Karasumi is made through the repetition of the process of salting washed Mullet roe and drying in the sunlight. It is said to be one of Japan's top three delicacies and is the best appetizer for Sake.



Yori-Yori (A Chinese sweet delight)

You may be surprised by its hardness – something that you cannot imagine from its appearance! But its delicate sweetness and smooth taste will surely entice you.

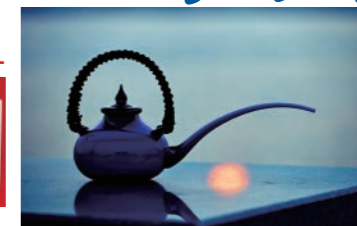
Toruko rice

"Toruko rice" was made around 50 years ago in Nagasaki. It is a voluminous dish with rice pilaf, spaghetti, salad and pork cutlet lumped onto the same plate.



Nagasaki Wagyu

Nagasaki Wagyu features its fresh red meat, soft texture and smooth flavor. "Dejima Bara-iro beef" ("Bara-iro" means the color of rose flowers) is a special brand. Only 9% of all the cows bred in Nagasaki qualify for this brand and more than 80% of which are grade 4-5.



Nagasaki vidro

The term "vidro" came from Portuguese meaning glass. By blowing into the rod, you can shape the molten glass and create a beautiful tinge of color.
